Frequently Asked Questions:

How do I know if I am eligible for a PDMRA payment? If you were part of an involuntary mobilization and were released from active duty between 19 Jan 2007 –18 Aug 2007 you may be eligible for a PDMRA. Please visit our PDMRA web page at <http://www.texasnationalguard.us> if you have questions or wish to verify PDMRA eligibility.

I am a current member of the TX Army National Guard; what do I need to do to receive PDMRA? Monitor your AKO email and the PDMRA team will contact you for individual verification.

When can I expect to receive my PDMRA payment? The Texas National Guard will diligently process and validate PDMRA payments for every eligible Texas National Guard Soldier who is owed this benefit.

What is the cutoff date for PDMRA cash payments? According to NGB guidance, the Texas National Guard has until 1 October 2010 to process all PDMRA payments. There will be no exceptions or extensions to this deadline.

How will I receive my PDMRA payment? All PDMRA payments will be in the form of electronic fund transfer (EFT). Fund transfers for those eligible will be sent as soon our certification process is complete.

How will I receive my PDMRA payment if I am discharged or retired from the TX Army National Guard? Soldiers that have retired or have been honorably discharged will receive their PDMRA payment via electronic funds transfer. You MUST fill out a DD Form 827, Application for Arrears in Pay and a SF 1199A, Direct Deposit Sign-up Form that can be found at <http://www.texasnationalguard.us> .

Will my PDMRA be taxed? Yes, PDMRA is characterized as “Special Pay” by the Army which will result in federal and state income tax deductions.
